



CraftForms is one of the nation's most recognized contemporary exhibitions of its kind. The finest works of basketry, ceramics, fiber, furniture, glass, jewelry, metal, mixed media, paper, wearable art, wood, and 3D printing are presented in the Davenport Gallery.

"This year, CraftForms 2024 features 102 artists from 34 states and three countries, including Canada, Japan, and Taiwan," exclaimed Nancy Campbell, CraftForms founder and Executive Director of Wayne Art Center, home of the popular exhibition. In its 29th year, the international exhibition of contemporary fine art brings established and emerging artists together to share their creative talent with the Wayne Art Center community and the Greater Philadelphia region.

CraftForms is one of the nation's most recognized contemporary exhibitions of its kind. The finest works of basketry, ceramics, fiber, furniture, glass, jewelry, metal, mixed media, paper, wearable art, wood, and 3D printing are presented in the Davenport Gallery. In the Ethel Sergeant Clark Smith Gallery, a companion exhibit entitled Japandí Revisited: shared aesthetics and influences is in conjunction with CraftForms. A third partner, Attraction to Abstraction, is showcased in the Vidinghoff Gallery and Radnor Township Lobby Gallery. All three exhibitions continued through January 25.




received curatorial training at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art



center's adult students, as well as members of the community. "There are 24 artists who created 30-inch or larger works," noted Campbell. "The exhibit also highlights the painting *Untitled* by Quita Brodhead, one of our visionary founders in 1930. Beginning in 1938 and continuing for the rest of her life, she exhibited frequently in galleries and museums with solo and group shows in New York City; Philadelphia; Washington, DC; Paris; and Rome. Before she died in 2002 at 101, retrospective shows were held at Wayne Art Center, the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, and Hollis Taggart, celebrating her 100th birthday."
