## WAYNE ART CENTER'S 2025 STUDENT WORKS EXHIBITION ON EXHIBIT THROUGH AUGUST 15

**WAYNE**, **PA**—**August 4**, **2025**. Don't miss a final opportunity to view *Wayne Art Center's 2025 Student Works Exhibition* before it closes on Friday, August 15.

This year's annual exhibition features 302 drawings, paintings, sculptures, ceramics, jewelry, stained glass, works on paper, photography and mixed media works created by adult students who have been enrolled in Wayne Art Center's classes and workshops during the 2024-2025 school year.

Christine Clay served as Juror of Awards for 2025 Student Works. Clay is an artist, illustrator and art educator. Currently a painting and drawing instructor at Villanova University, Clay has taught at numerous schools, centers and institutions while simultaneously creating and exhibiting her own work. Regarding her experience with the work in this year's exhibit, the juror shares "Upon entering the exhibition, I realized that choosing among the vast array of student work would be a challenging but enjoyable experience. The level of skill and abundant display of

creative thought in each piece is a testament to the commitment of the artist and the ability of the instructor to draw it out. The range of subject matter from photorealism to abstract gestures reflects the unique quality of each artist to speak and contributes to a diversity of thought and intention necessary for a community to thrive and for an individual to prosper."

An awards presentation held during the exhibition's public reception on July 24, 2025, revealed this year's award-winning work.

"Wayne Art Center is proud to recognize and support our talented adult students in their creative pursuits through this diverse exhibition which features a variety of mediums and styles. We applaud the dedication and expertise of our faculty who are committed to fostering creativity, skill development, and a lifelong love of art in our adult students", commented Nancy Campbell, Executive Director and Chief Curator.
